SIGA 2025 should approve this motion because:

- it enables wealthier member countries to support struggling member countries in an efficient and effective manner.
- Small donations between member countries can have significant added costs due to wire transfer fees. If small donations are solicited from multiple countries, there will be multiple wire transfer fees expended thus reducing the total amount of funds the receiving country will get.
- Small donations between member countries can be both complicated and time consuming for both donor and receiver countries to organize, especially if a country is soliciting from multiple countries
- For donor countries, it is difficult to determine which causes to support and which are most in alignment with SI values. SI is better placed to have a good understanding of all global activities that warrant assistance.

7. SI budget implications

• No net implication to SI budget. A reserve fund would be established where member countries can voluntarily contribute yearly when they send in their annual fee.

Member countries seeking financial support (for peace schools, essay competitions, etc.) could apply for funding from the reserve fund. SI would then vet the applications and allocate the funds (not to exceed the amount held in reserve for such purposes).

8. Other resources needed — time, experts with specialist competences or knowledge or other human resources.

- SI would need someone or a committee to vet the applications.
- SI treasurer would need to:
- send funds for approved applications and
- account to the donors on an annual basis for the funds in and out of the "donation reserve account", including fees.

The proposed action should ideally:

- Start on this date: 2025-10-09.
- Be reviewed for effectiveness during the next SICOGA on this date: 2028-10-01.
