The next day we were transported south, ferried across Lake Victoria into Mwanza, Tanzania, his home where he arranged accomodations for us during our stay. He arranged meals and activities during our stay there which were culturally immersive: Presentation at the Sukuma Museum Cultural Center that explained the tribes in the area; Visited two schools where David is building restrooms to be used by the girls so they have a place to change their menstrual pads so they can continue with their schooling and not stay home; arranged for fisherman on Lake Victoria to take us out in their fishing boats; took us to the shop where disabled men (no use of legs) construct bicycles that can be peddeled by hand for other disabled people. This is all done by donation. Arranged for an African artist to work with those in our group who wanted to try painting in a certain style; arranged for a tour of the Serengeti where we saw a gigantic herd of hippos, lions and other wildlife. He is a Super Servas Host and developer of ideas that can lead to cross-cultural connections amongst Servas people from around the world with his part of the world. He comes with my strong endorsement.
